From Barbara...

Change is a difficult thing for most people. We're comfortable with what we've "always" done and with what's always been. But change is what Christianity is about. Repentance isn't just about turning away from sin but changing our ways to God's ways. Becoming disciples changes our lives. Take time this week to look at the things that need to be changed in your life to become a better disciple.

I've been noticing the number of people who come to church late and/or leave early. We, the Church, celebrate the beginning of Mass with the opening song or prayer and end Mass with the closing prayer or song. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, one of the Vatican II documents, calls us to "full, conscious, and active participation." The sacred liturgy is more than "hearing" the readings and "taking" communion. It's not a private action but a community prayer. When people are coming late or leaving early it's disruptive to the community. I know that at times, there will be extraordinary reasons for having to be late or leave early. But I invite you to consider "changing" your Saturday or Sunday routine to make Mass a priority. It may mean starting to get ready a little bit earlier, or scheduling the next event for a little later. It's a "change" worth making and will make our community celebration of God's love that much better. How will you respond to Jesus' challenge to the disciples – can you not stay with me for one hour? How will you respond to Jesus' challenge to the disciples - can you not stay with me for one hour?

And still another change – many of you may have received a mailing from the Archbishop for his Annual Appeal. You will note that it has been changed from the "Lenten Appeal." The change was made to take it outside of Lent so that we can focus on the important liturgical and spiritual importance of the season. Please be generous in this important Archdiocesan appeal. THE ARCHBISHOP'S LENTEN APPEAL IS NOW THE ARCHBISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL

The Archbishop has approved changing the name of the Archbishop's Lenten Appeal to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. The campaign will now take place prior to Lent each year so that the Appeal does not interfere with Lenten liturgies.

Many of our parishioners either have or soon will receive a mailing from Archbishop O'Brien. He will ask that you make a pledge to the 2009 Archbishop's Annual Appeal.

The Appeal not only funds the operations of the Archdiocese, it funds services that are of great help to the ministries here in our parish. For example, we received a grant of \$500 for our youth ministry program

This year, the theme of the Appeal is, "Do everything for the glory of God." Clearly, everything that we do to live out our faith gives glory to God. Our contributions to our parishes and our Archdiocese multiply the glory that we give to our God by enabling ministries and services that touch thousands of lives.

Our parishes receives 25% of each dollar contributed up to our goal. The goal for St. Anthony is \$18,472 and Our Lady of Mount Carmel is \$14,649. Then, we receive 50% of the additional funds received. As we have in the past, this year, we will commit our parish rebates to our sister parish in Haiti.
