In what ways are you paralyzed? There are many things in our past that can keep us from acting in the present or planning for the future. Sometimes we wallow in what has happened – good and bad. Lent begins this Wednesday. There are many things that will be happening during Lent that you may want to take advantage of. Some of them are:

"The Light is on For You" is a program the Archbishop has initiated in the Archdiocese. Every Wednesday during Lent (except for Ash Wednesday and the Wednesday of Holy Week) every parish will have a priest in the church hearing confessions from 7-8:30 pm. One of the great things about being a Catholic is that we can admit our guilt and struggles to a priest and experience God's forgiveness through this prayerful sign.
