#### From Barbara...

Last week I wrote about asking for miracles and God seemingly not answering because he didn't answer in the way we'd hoped. Today's gospel offers us another way that we reject God's answer – because we are not receptive to the messenger. We aren't always accepting of God's message because of the speaker. The people of Jesus' time questioned his authority because they didn't think he was knowledgeable enough nor did he have the prestige that they were looking for. He was one of them. Take time this week to listen to those around you, those from whom you may not usually listen to or those you think don't have the "credentials" to speak credibly. Who is God using to speak the Gospel to you?

Prayer Pointers from Sheila Garcia, Associate Director, Secretariat for Laity, Marriage, Family Life and Youth, USCCB (continued from last week):

- **5. Short prayers count, too.** When you're stopped at a long light or put on hold, consider it as God's invitation to turn your heart and mind to Him. If only for a few seconds.
- **6. Find God at work.** Connecting with God in the workplace takes effort. Try to cultivate a few simple habits. For example, offer the day to God as you turn on your computer.

## Sacred Stitches: Historic Vestment Exhibit at the Baltimore Basilica

Some of the historic vestments from the Basilica's collection will be on display in the temporary exhibit space until September 27. The exhibit includes James Cardinal Gibbons' golden vestments, which he wore during the Third Plenary Council in 1884 (the Basilica Museum showcases the matching chalice veil and burse); a set of Irish Poplin vestments from the bishop and clergy of the Diocese of Ardagh and Clonmacnoise, to Archbishop Michael J. Curley, which feature stunning hand-stitched Celtic designs; along with several other beautiful and historic vestments.
