


Fall Yard & Bake Sale

There's a line at the very end of the musical "Les Miserables" that says "to love another person is to see the face of God." I have always found that the best way to experience God is in relationship with another person. From the very beginning God saw the value in human relationships and Jesus reaffirms that value by the very fact that he became human and lived on earth. He experienced human emotions and the gospels tell us of the many relationships that he had during his life. Take time this week to see the face of God in those you love and to develop your relationship with God.

You may have noticed that we now have hand sanitizer at the entrance of each church/worship space and also on the credence table for the Eucharistic Ministers to use before and after they distribute Holy Communion.
