Today's Gospel is one of my favorites. Matthew gives us an image of Jesus shown in all of his glory being placed along side of two of the great Hebrew figures, Moses and Elijah. He has taken with him a select few of the apostles. But the story is being told for all of us to hear. In addition, Matthew attributes to God the same phrase that he used at the Baptism of Jesus, "This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased." And this time he adds "listen to him." In this gospel we get a glimpse of the divinity of Jesus and we are privileged to be connected to that divinity through our baptism. Take time this week to look for God's blessings in your life and how it can transfigure you to reflect God's glory.

As Lent continues we have many opportunities to experience God's grace. Our parishes are open to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation every Wednesday (check the schedule to confirm the location); every Friday we pray together the Stations of the Cross; we also on Fridays can share fellowship with others at the Fish Bakes; and this week we can help serve the poor by providing a casserole for the Frederick Rescue Mission. Pans are available in the back of our churches with details. I hope you will take advantage of at least one of these activities.
