# From Barbara...

In the gospels we hear stories of people of great faith. People who believed Jesus could do anything and asked him for it. Their request was heard and granted because of their faith. There is a phrase that says, "Believe as if everything depended on God; Act as if everything depended on you." Our faith is what gives us the strength to work for the greater glory of God. Take time this week to acknowledge the strength of your faith and the rewards it has brought to your life.

Monday is the Feast of the Assumption. The parish offices will be closed because of the feast but because it is a Monday it is not a holy day of obligation. We will have our regularly scheduled Mass on Monday morning at 8:00 at Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Just because it is not a holy day of obligation, we can still take the time to honor our Blessed Mother on her feast day.

Another question came up in the survey that was concerned about where our poor box donations go. Each month in the bulletin is printed a list and amount of money that goes to each organization. But the breakdown is as follows: 4.39% goes to international organizations; 2.64% goes to national organizations; 4.62% **Baltimore** goes to organizations; 1.76% Frederick goes to organizations; and 86.59% goes to local Emmitsburg/ Thurmont organizations. Sometimes we dedicate a poor box to assist in a particular relief effort such as the tsunami in Japan or the storms in Missouri but that is always publicized in advance.
