There was a concern expressed in the survey about payoffs for the sex abuse scandals and if any of your offertory contributions go to the payouts. The policy in the Archdiocese of Baltimore is not to settle any case out of court with a "payoff." allegation is made the reporter is encouraged to also report it to the civil authorities. If the Archdiocese finds an allegation to be credible, they report it to the proper civil and church authorities and remove the priest from ministry. They offer to pay for counseling for both the victim/survivor and the priest. Of course, if someone sues the Archdiocese and there is a court ordered settlement they must abide by the court decision. The Archdiocese has insurance to cover these costs. I hope this makes the process clearer and will help you when determining your regular parish contribution. Please contact me if you have any further questions.
