Department 14 – Fruit and Nuts

General Rules:

See General Fair Rules and Regulations.

- 1. In selecting fruit for exhibition, choose specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest; select medium size specimens. For plate displays, select specimens as nearly alike as possible.
- 2. Each exhibitor must designate the variety entered and arrange the specimens on a plate, tray, etc., in a manner acceptable to the committee. Entries incorrectly named will be disqualified or transferred to the proper variety group at the discretion of the committee.
- 3. All fruit specimens per entry must be of the same variety.
- 4. If only one or two entries are made of an uncommon variety, these entries will be judged based upon a comparison of the entry with a published description of the variety.
- 5. Premiums will be offered on merit of excellence, not entry alone. Therefore, in any one class all premiums may not be awarded, if in the judge's opinion, the other entries do not merit placement. This may result in the omission of some placements such as first or second for awarding of only a third.
- 6. Exhibits will be accepted on Sunday July 21, 2024, from 2-4 p.m., and on Monday, July 22, 2024, from 4-7 p.m. **NO exhibits will be accepted after 7:00 p.m. Plan to arrive early**. Early registration is encouraged. All exhibitors must have an exhibitor number at a cost of \$2.00 per exhibitor. This fee is waived if the exhibitor pre-registers their entries by July 14. The General Entries form can be found at the back of this book or on the web site at www.southmountainfair.com. The exhibitor's name, address and phone number along with the department, section, and class information is required for pre-registration. Completed exhibit cards will be mailed to the exhibitor.
- 7. The committee will remove any spoiled fruit and will spray as needed to control fruit flies.
- 8. Grapes, peaches, and nectarines that are overripe at the end of the exhibition period will be discarded.
- 9. Exhibits will be released to exhibitors after the Fair on Sunday from 2:00-4:00 p.m. No prize money will be awarded for exhibits removed in violation of this rule. No ribbons will be mailed, any unclaimed ribbons will be reused next year. Any exhibits not picked up on Sunday by 4:00 p.m. will be given to a food pantry (if usable) or will be discarded.
